Suggested At Home Learning Activities for self isolation

EYFS

Many of these activities should be able to be done at home without needing to buy any resources. This is not a tick list for you to work down, choose your favourites and do them as many times as you like - repeating them is good!!

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Massage – pretend to make a cake or build a pizza on your partner’s back
- Share stories – retell and act them out
- Make bread together
- Chop the vegetables for dinner together
- Give your children responsibility to help with household chores – spray the window cleaner and clean the window is a favourite
- Look at Cosmic Kids Yoga on YouTube and join in together
- Sharing a family meal and talk about your day
- Threading pasta on to wool or string
- Water play in the bath – scooping, pouring and measuring
- Design a treasure hunt around the house
- Junk modelling
- 📌 Make playdough together (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?=jv73CEzY1jg>)
- Musical movement games similar to musical statues
- Lego and block play – plan to build something and then see if you can follow your plan
- Make sensory play – shaving foam, jelly, soap
- Painting with water in the garden
- Building dens with tunnels and blankets
- Watch episodes of ‘Come outside’

- Story telling with home made puppets (old socks, lolly sticks, straws)
- Singing nursery rhymes and action songs (Twinkle Twinkle, Wind the bobbin up, 5 little monkeys)
- Make music with saucepans and pots
- Play guessing games (Think of an animal – help your child by modelling how to give clues to guess the animal)
- Play board games
- Learn to sign Makaton with Mr tumble

Maths

- Pairing socks
- Playing snakes and ladders
- Add numbers to pegs help your child to order them
- Measure ingredients help make dinner
- Sing number songs (5 currant buns, 12345 once I caught a fish alive etc)
- Sorting toys by colour or shape
- Sorting coins
- Build train tracks in different shapes
- Build towers from blocks, how many blocks did you use? Can you use the same blocks to build a different tower?



Literacy

- Share story books and share what's happening on each page
- Play lotto games matching pictures
- Hide an object in a mystery bag and give clues to what might be inside
- Tap out syllables to break up your name using hands or musical instruments
- Practise writing your name
- Blowing bubbles
- Making bread or pizza
- Read
- Information books
- Hunt for bugs in the garden
- Use 'nature detectives' for lots of exciting activities to do at home

- Planting seeds such as cress as watch them grow

- Observe the weather each day and make a chart
- Make a family tree who is in your family
- Freeze small toys in ice and work out how to get them out
- Make a rainbow of skittles sweets around the edge of a small plate add warm water and watch the rainbow appear
- Feed the birds in the garden and keep a tally of birds that visit your garden

- Dancing to music using scarves
- Sing familiar songs and make up your own words to nursery rhyme tunes
- Make shakers with pasta or rice in pots
- Make your own paint with shaving foam or coloured ice
- Make props for your favourite story and act it out together

These activities are fun for pupils of any age not restricted to EYFS!

- Quick Write- if you were king or queen what would you do?
- Purple Mash - Children have their own logins
- Design your own kingdom- what would your palace/crown look like?
- Draw a self-portrait of yourself as a king or queen
- Read a biography of a king or queen
- Make a book
- Play board games and card games with your family
- Research your family tree
- Write a diary of your time at home, include the weather, what you ate and what activities you did
